Goal 1: Eastside Elementary will use various communication strategies to provide additional information to parents and to increase parental involvement in supporting classroom instruction.

- The school will distribute a bi-monthly newsletter to parents that is developed with the participation of the
 parent-school organization, principal, staff and parent volunteers. It includes school news, a calendar of
 school activities, and parenting tips related to school achievement such as homework tips, organizational

- Each Teacher will send home a folder containing student papers and work samples each week. Parents will be asked to sign the folder and send it back to school. (Regular Classroom Teachers, Stacy Allen, Principal; August- May 2015)
- Teachers will routinely contact parents on an individual basis to communicate about their child's progress.
 (Regular Classroom Teachers, Carol Skiba, Assistant Principal/Instructional Facilitator; August-May 2015)

Goal 2: Eastside Elementary will hold regularly scheduled parent meetings, conferences, and various activities throughout the school year providing flexible meeting times with the goal of increasing parental involvement and build staff and parent capacity to engage in these types of efforts.

- Teachers will hold conferences individually with parents of children in their classrooms. Parents will be given a summary of the student's test scores and an explanation of the interventions teachers are using to assist the child in reaching achievement goals. Parents will be asked to engage in discussion of how they can support these efforts. Parents will also be given suggestions for coordinating school-parent efforts and explanations of homework and grading procedures. - The school will offer parents a special workshop each year to provide an explanation of the statewide assessment system, standards, and other accountability measures. (Stacy Allen, Principal; September 9, 2014)

Goal 3: Eastside Elementary will provide information to parents about volunteer opportunities.

- Provide instruction to a parent on how to incorporate developmentally appropriate learning activities in the
 home environment, including without limitation: role play and demonstration by trained volunteer, the use
 of and access to the Department of Education website tools for parents, assistance with nutritional meal
 planning and preparation and other strategies or curricula developed or acquired by the school district for

 - Eastside Elementary Parent Resource Center hours of operation: Monday-Friday during regular school hours and any after school special event.
- The school will distribute informational packets each year that includes a copy of the school's parental involvement plan, survey for volunteer interests, recommended roles for parents/ teachers/students and school, suggestions of ways parents can become involved in their child's education, parental involvement activities planned for the current school year and information about the system that will be used to allow parents and teachers to communicate.
