## **CONSENT AGENDA**

**National Substitute Educator of the Year Winner** – Mary Beth Sanders, Keith Elliott, Chris Rueben, and Marie Duncan from Kelly Services recognized Megan Mabry as the Kelly Services National Substitute Educator of the Year winner for support staff. Ms. Mabry is a substitute secretary in the Student Success Center at Cabot High School. She received \$5,000 for herself and \$1,500 for the school of her choice for winning this award.

#### CURRICULUM REPORT

**PLC/Student Academic Performance Report** — Stacy Allen reported that Middle School North has reduced discipline infractions by 43% through the use of their behavioral referral system. Westside has seen a remarkable improvement in their attendance by using individual incentives for attendance, and the administrative team met with parents during parent teacher conferences to talk about the importance of regular attendance.

The Child Development Center exterior renovation is complete and classroom setup will begin in June. A plan is in place and has been communicated for the construction along Panther Trail this summer. Carpet removal projects will continue this summer. Inclusive playground installations were completed today. The fence damage at the tennis center has been fixed. There will be some renovations at Middle School South, including painting and lighting. Office renovations at Middle School North will begin in July.
