Memorial Wreaths Relay at Cabot High School to Honor Veterans

Walmart Sponsors Over 30,000 Wreaths To Be Laid at National Cemeteries In Support of Of Wreaths Across America and provides transportation support across the United States

Cabot High School December 12th – Walmart is donating the services of 16 tractor/trailers to transport over 80,000 wreaths to memorial ceremonies across the country as part of the company's involvement in Wreaths Across America and National Wreath Laying Day.

On December 12th, two trailer loads of balsam fir memorial wreaths will be relayed through the Searcy distribution center and will be brought to Cabot High School for a ceremony to begin at 09:30. Thirty-six Walmart Distribution Centers and one hundred Walmart drivers across the country will be involved in transporting wreaths from Columbia Falls, Maine to their destinations.

Walmart support includes a \$150,000 donation that will help Wreaths Across America purchase 30,000 wreaths for placement at national cemeteries and memorial sites across the United States, including Arlington National Cemetery. Walmart trucks will deliver over 80,000 wreaths to national cemeteries in 13 states and the District of Columbia (Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Florida, Kentucky, Michigan, New York, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia).

Wreaths Across America and Walmart recognize the sacrifices of our nation's veterans with the wreath laying ceremonies in over 900 national cemeteries worldwide.

December 13, 2013 is National Wreath-Laying Day.
